 COVID UPDATE: HAD A GOOD 5½ MONTH RUN BEFORE LUCK RAN OUT IN MID-FEBRUARY IN MID-FEBRUARY, 6 WESTGATE STUDENTS (FROM 5 DIFFERENT IN- PERSON COHORTS) TESTED POSITIVE FEBRUARY 19TH – WESTGATE TAGGED WITH "OUTBREAK" STATUS AFTER SCHOOL TRANSMISSION WAS CONFIRMED FEBRUARY 21ST – WESTGATE MOVED TO FULLY VIRTUAL LEARNING (ONE WEEK BEFORE THE ENTIRE SYSTEM MADE THE SAME MOVE DUE TO RISING COMMUNITY NUMBERS) IN EARLY MARCH, COVID HIT WESTGATE'S CUSTODIAL STAFF VERY HARD 7 CUSTODIANS TESTED POSITIVE IN OUR BUILDING DURING THE MONTH OF MARCH WESTGATE TAGGED A SECOND TIME WITH "OUTBREAK" STATUS OUR ENTIRE CUSTODIAL TEAM WAS OFF WORK MUCH OF THE MONTH HAVE BEGUN TO TRICKLE BACK TO US LAST WEEK (WEEK OF MARCH 22) HAPPY TO REPORT THAT ALL WESTGATE COVID CASES HAVE BEEN RESOLVED AND NO HOSPITALIZATIONS OCCURRED WITH ANY STAFF OR

New Business	COMPASS SURVEY RESULTS:
	Unfortunately, our tigers have regressed in the areas noted below (*likely the result of covid):
	 The number of kids meeting the national guidelines for physical activity has dropped by 9% (from 74% to 65%).
	• The number of kids meeting the national guidelines for screen time has <u>dropped by 2%</u> (to 3%). That means, 97% of our students spend an unhealthy amount of time on their phones and computers. I'm sure that is a shock to no one.
	 The number of kids who feel a part of their school has dropped by 9% (to 60%).
	 The number of kids who rate their mental health as good or excellent has dropped by 9% (to 55%). 57% of our tigers reported that their loneliness has increased as a result of covid. 47% reported that their anxiety has increased as a result of covid. And, a whopping 35% of our student population report feeling depressed most days. The number of kids who have been bullied increased by 6% (to 21%). 13% of the bullying was in-person verbally; 10% was online; and, 4% was physical.
	And here are some small victories:
	 Although 17% of our kids report their alcohol use has increased because of covid, binge-drinking overall has gone down by 5% (to 18%). Although 14% of our kids report their cannabis use has increased because of covid, cannabis use overall has gone down by 5% (to 21%). Vaping use has dropped by 14% (to 28%).
	 98% of our kids reported that they take government rules about covid somewhat or very seriously. The number of kids who are eating breakfast daily increased by 5% (to 36%).
	When the dust all settles on this situation, Westgate will have a lot of work to do to fully recover.
